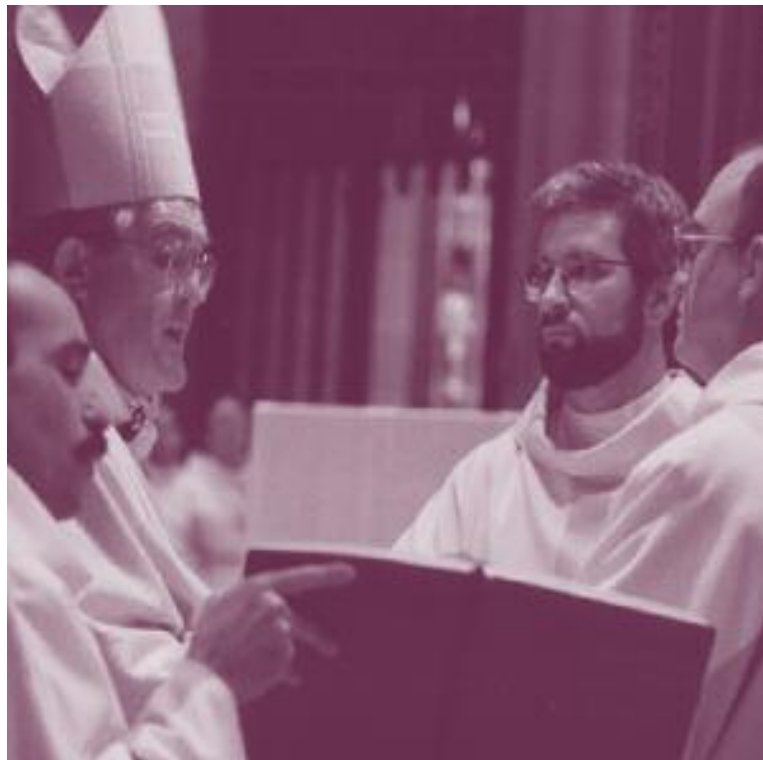

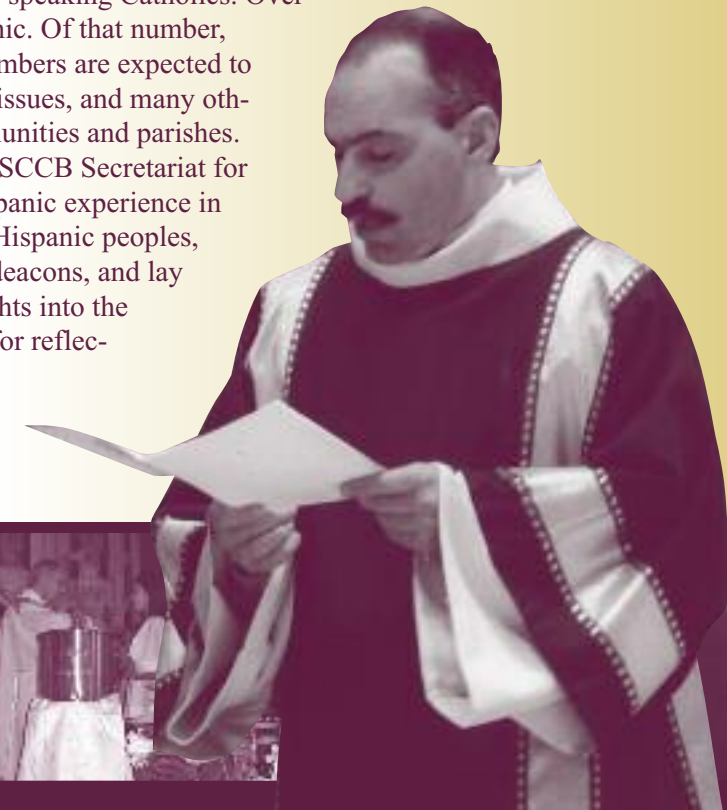
Thus those who serve well as deacons gain good standing and much confidence in their faith in Christ Jesus. (1 TIM 3:13)

A deacon is forever. The National Directory has placed increased emphasis on continuing education in recent years. *The Institute for the Formation and Ministry of the Diaconate* at the Pontifical College Josephinum has been chartered to provide multiple opportunities for deacons to consider, learn, and reflect upon their critical role in the modern Church.

We are blessed with the charism of liturgical service to the people of God. We are present to rejoice at moments of great joy and happiness, and we are present to console and counsel at moments of sadness and bereavement. "As an ordained participant in the Church's ministry of liturgy, the deacon confirms his identity as servant of the Body of Christ. In the celebration of the sacraments, whether he serves as a presider or assists the presider, 'let him remember that, when lived with faith and reverence, these actions of the Church contribute much to growth in the spiritual life and to the increase of the Christian community'" (*National Directory, paragraph 82*).

Our first workshop, "Life-Changing Liturgies," focuses on three liturgies familiar to all deacons: the sacraments of Baptism and Matrimony, as well as Funeral and Commitment Rites. Father Daniel E. Mackle, M.A., M.Div., will lead a cadre of experienced priests and deacons who will address each topic in turn. An experienced Pastor, Father Mackle is also Professor of Sacred Liturgy at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary, and was formerly Director of the Office of Worship (1988-2004) for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. Small group sessions following each presentation will allow for reflection and exchange of ideas among the deacons attending.

Our second workshop, "Unity in Diversity – The Hispanic Church in the United States in the Twenty-First Century," addresses the demographic changes occurring in the Church in the United States, with particular emphasis on ways we might enhance the worship experience for Spanish-speaking Catholics. Over thirty-five million Americans describe themselves as Hispanic. Of that number, nearly forty percent are under the age of eighteen. These numbers are expected to grow exponentially over the next decade. We address these issues, and many others, as we explore the impact of these changes on our communities and parishes. Rev. Allan Figueroa Deck, S.J., Executive Director of the USCCB Secretariat for Cultural Diversity, and noted author and speaker on the Hispanic experience in North America, will provide insight into ministering to the Hispanic peoples, from a national perspective, and other experienced priests, deacons, and lay persons will provide diocesan, parochial, and personal insights into the topic. Small group sessions will again provide opportunity for reflection, dialog and exchange of ideas among the deacons and presenters present for the workshop.
