## Editor's Story

I would like to share a few words about a unique opportunity my husband Rich and I had to "adopt" Columbus seminarian Shawn Caslow. Shawn is completing his spiritual year at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary in Pennsylvania and anticipates beginning at the Josephinum in the fall.

Being a first for us, we didn't know quite how to begin this "parenting." I began with a letter to Shawn; we received the nicest letter in return and



exchanged addresses, phone numbers, and emails. Rich and I met Shawn in Columbus on New Year's Day when he served Mass with Bishop Fernandes.

What a great match we are! Shawn is a graduate of a high school in Dublin, the suburb where Rich and I live. Shawn and I are both Ohio State alumni. He studied criminal justice; I studied there to prepare for my career teaching high school at the Ohio Reformatory for Women in Marysville.

While Shawn was raised Protestant, he began to experience a draw to the Catholic faith at age 20. In the beginning he was afraid and "wanted to run" but kept experiencing, as he says, awakenings and joy when at Mass with friends. Shawn went on retreats, attended adoration, and was introduced to the Rosary, during which, he says, "Our Lady sent me a memo." Through intense trials, Shawn realized Christ had always been with him. Shawn relates that, during his spiritual year, the steps he experienced have been the call, resistance, acceptance, embracement, and commitment. How beautiful!
